may not be on the QCC mailing list. QCC members may invite a guest to play with their foursome.

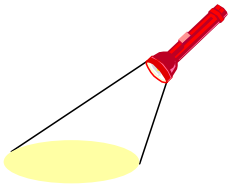

IF YOU TRAVEL TO BANGALORE

Special report by Juan Perez

I've had the opportunity to travel to Bangalore, India twice last year to teach an IBM project management course. Since I had already been there once in 2002, I sort of had an idea of what to expect both during the journey and also once I arrived.

Located at the southern part of India, Bangalore has gained world-wide attention because of its growth in the software and call center industry. Unfortunately, there aren't direct flights from the USA into Bangalore.

Air France from Paris, or British Air from London, will get you there around 1 AM. The British Air 777 Boeing has a different power port for your laptop; you will need an adaptor which is not available from the crew. Also, I try to avoid flying through New Delhi or Mumbai due to their not-so-nice airports. Once there, there are many taxis available to take you to the hotels.

Hotel prices have escalated in the last 5 years. In 2002, my hotel, the Taj Residency, cost \$99 per night, compared to \$286 in 2007. Rooms and service at these hotels are great. Other than hotel prices, most other services are very reasonable. Street taxis are inexpensive, although the drivers are tough negotiators, especially with hotel guests. The yellow and black street taxi is usually a 3-wheel motorcycle with a seating carriage in the rear. It is powered by either a 2-cycle engine (which smokes a lot), or a propane powered engine.



There are few if any lane markings, so all drivers are wandering back and forth between each other. If you are interested, I can continue this story on the next issue.
